

## "Basic Concealment"

• Introduction to Vehicular Concealed Compartment • Bulk Currency concealment & transportation methods • Understanding Narcotic Organizations and their methods of operating • Recognizing verbal and physical indicators • Common indicators of modified vehicles • Standard tools that will assist in the search • Information on the most common currency hides in vehicles • Commercial Motor Vehicle concealment methods • Currency Concealment methods in furniture and residences • Case Studies on residential bulk currency seizures • Concealment methods in Commercial establishments • Unusual methods of concealment • Financial Operation – Concealment Trap Initiative • Introduction to the DEA – Financial Operations – Trap Initiative Program
