The Texas Narcotic Officers' Association – East Region along with the DEA Houston Field Office will host an 8-hour (1-day) training course entitled “**DETECTING DANGER**” in Houston, Texas. Registration is open and TCOLE hours will be available.

This 1-day course will be conducted over two evenings during the hours of 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm immediately following an Interview and Interrogation class being conducted during the daytime.

Check in will begin at 5:30 pm on both days and the course will start promptly at 6:00 pm on Monday, September 11, 2017, at the DEA Houston Field Office – first floor training room.

Course Overview

This 8-hour course of instruction is intended to educate the student on recognition of the verbal and non-verbal indicators that the subconscious mind is processing anger/violence prior to the manifestation of action.

To break down the specific indicators of anger/violence this lesson assists the student in recognizing the verbal indicators of deception and how word tense and usage can be used in the evaluation of individuals' intentions. The important arena of Non-verbal communication, as the majority of communication utilized by humans, is broken into specific non-verbal gestures that suggest emotional responses of anger or violence important to the police officer. The reason humans utilize body language and the Principles and Rules that apply are highlighted. Proxemics and the effective use of space are presented to the student so that an area of safety may be established during field contacts. Videos and practical demonstrations emphasize the important teaching points in this program.
